Gatherings of MG enthusiasts like ours go on all around the world. Owning an MG makes you part of the worldwide family and now with Facebook etc that family is easily accessible on your own computer. There a number of MG related Facebook groups covering most models where you can find the answer to most technical and ownership questions within minutes.

At the SFR weeked I took the opportunity of a test drive of the new ZS model that was there courtesy of John Hughes. It was an impressive vehicle, very comfortable, with all the bells and whistles of modern car technology, room for five adults, on sale at a very reasonable price and with a 7 year warranty and roadside assistance. I recommend members to also take a test drive of one of the new generation MG's.

We are so lucky owning an MG as there are a readily available wide range of spare parts for our cars. I have fitted LED flasher bulbs to my MGA and they are much brighter and consume far less current. I also now have LED headlamp bulbs on my TD, standard BPF replacements, plus LED panel bulbs and the amp meter shows a healthy positive charge rate with all lights on. A major improvement.

On behalf of the club I attended the WA Council of Motoring Clubs general Meeting on 15 October. One gain for the users of Concessional Licenced cars [Code 404] is that the Dept of Transport have removed the Condition 001 requirement "Licence to be carried in vehicle at all times'. This should happen at your next licence renewal, however if Code 404 owners notice that it has not been removed, please e-mail me and I will advise the CMC. The other item that may be of interest, is that the Classic Car Show at Ascot next year will be held on Sunday 24th March.

- Remember, the Dept of Transport do<u>not</u> allow any DAYS of GRACE on concession licences, for payment of your membership renewal.
- In simple terms, you need to pay your membership renewal <u>before</u> 31st December, to keep your vehicle registration and very importantly, the third party injury covers in force. Otherwise the vehicle needs to be off the road and not used.
- Renewal notices will be distributed towards the end of November for you to act on please.
- We know, December and New Year is a time when members can be away on holiday and particularly important they make Arrangements to pay before departing, as we are required, under regulations, to report any unpaid concession licence memberships which are unpaid.

This we want, obviously, to avoid in everyone's interest.

DAY ONE of the Safety Fast Run



After months of anticipation the day was finally upon us. I had been very much looking forward to the SFR and some top down motoring. Unfortunately, the forecast for Days 1 & 2 was not the best, particularly for the Margaret River region. True to the form guide, Day 1 dawned overcast so hood stayed tightly fastened on.

The drive down to Ravenswood was uneventful and unusually, I barely saw any MGs. When I arrived pretty close to the nominated 8am rendezvous time, I found that nearly everyone else was obviously very keen and were already parked-up and having a chat in the carpark or inside the hotel. After a coffee or two and the customary and tasty bacon and egg roll, the Day 1 pre-start briefing was held in the beer garden. Route instructions (complete with questions and arguments) were handed out and then we were off in SFR plate number order. All of us except the eventual "Hard Luck Award" winners Graham and Moyra Mitchinson – whose Midget's transmission cried ENOUGH when they attempted to move from their parking spot!

After heading to Pinjarra, the route then proceeded along the scenic Pinjarra-Williams Road. Proceeding is a term I use loosely, as I found myself in a queue of MGs as far as the eye could see, travelling at the speed of a funeral procession. I was thrilled when we reached a dizzying 70kmh max for a short distance. Otherwise almost the whole 24.6 km length of the road we traversed was at an insufferable 50kmh, no doubt enraging joe public road users with places to be and things to do. Relaxed cruising a little below the speed limit is fine, however travelling at approximately half the speed limit not only invites the ire of the public, but creates dangerous circumstances where other road users may make rash and dangerous overtaking moves out of frustration. Terry spoke of being respectful of other road users and not holding up traffic at the start briefing. Unfortunately, his message was lost on those at the head of this procession.

Eventually, we turned off Pinjarra-Williams Road onto Nanga and Nanga Brook Roads, which took us through the stunning Lane Poole Reserve. The scenery here was magnificent. Lush green forest, rolling hills, roadside streams and stunningly















beautiful countryside. I can't recall having been down these roads previously, but I'm planning to travel down them again soon, as they were just delightful!

Following a run down South West Highway to Burekup, we again took to the back roads and headed down past the Dardanup Conservation Park into the scenic Ferguson Valley, past Gnomesville and the Wellington Forest, eventually winding up at the Kirup Hall for lunch. Once again, the CWA put on a great lunch, with their fabulous cheesecake proving ever popular!

After lunch, there were no questions and arguments, just another great drive through fantastic State Forests heading south and then west along Mowen and Rosa Brook Roads to Margaret River.

While there was a fair bit of precipitation during the day, I actually found that quite enjoyable while cruising along the wonderful Day 1 route.

Congratulations to Tony Ford and Lesley Bell (route directors for Day 1), on putting together a fabulous day of touring. It was an outstanding effort clearly enjoyed by all, judging by the conversations during the evening festivities at Stay Margaret River.

The evening was also a hit, with the food and company once again being most enjoyable. I'm already looking forward to Albany next year.
