

Drive your MG to Base Camp, Mt Everest in 2020

By way of introduction, Ross Letten and I and our wives have driven our classic MGs around the world – literally – and now wish to conquer Base Camp Mt Everest. Previous trips include Beijing to London, Cape to Cairo, Pan-American Highway and Trans-Canada. All have been self-organised to keep costs to sensible levels without stinting on best accommodation available.

Experience has shown us that the optimum size for such a group is between four and six classic MGs. Further, it is useful if the cars are sufficiently similar so that they share spare parts and can be prepared to be rugged. In other words, we are looking for between two and four MGA or MGB owners to join us. Could you be one of them?

At this stage, we believe we will be the "First MGs to Conquer Mt Everest Base Camp".

The trip will start in Bangkok, Thailand in April 2020 and will visit attractions, many being UNESCO World Heritage sites, in Thailand, Cambodia, Vietnam and Laos, en route to meeting our personal guide in southern China.

In China and Tibet, we will visit such sites as Dali (Chongcheng pagodas and Erhai Lake), Lijiang (UNESCO World Heritage site), Tiger Leaping Gorge (third deepest gorge on earth), Zuogong (pass of the 72 curves to Ranwu Lake at 4,000 metres), Nyintri (Switzerland of the East), Lhasa (Capital of Tibet), Tsedang (first palace built in Tibet) and then Everest Base Camp!

For obvious reasons, it's important to realise that this offer is open to MG Adventurers who can work on their own cars and who don't mind chipping in to assist where needed. Affable types with well-prepared cars would be most welcome!

We wish to encourage as many MGs to be displayed as possible - of all varieties and whatever condition. It would be great to have a wide variety of MG models represented. So please bring out all your Midgets, MGAs, J Types & T Types, Classic Sedans, moderns etc and put them on display! We would love to see you there and allow others to have an opportunity to admire your car.

The event is a great opportunity to socialise and chat with fellow MG enthusiasts, as well as compete in the event if you wish. It is also a great time to invite your friends and family to join in as well. The event can be enjoyed with a BYO picnic under the trees on the banks of the river.

For the serious Concours buffs, the usual formalities and procedures will apply. A copy of the Judging Sheet and Entry Form have been provided with this flyer. The Judging Sheet has been provided to allow entrants to be familiar with the criteria used in judging so that they can present their cars appropriately. This should help achieve a "level playing field" for those new to Concours competition. Please note that an entry form is NOT required if you only wish to display your vehicle and do not want to participate in the formal Concours.

All Concours entrants will be eligible for trophies should they gain a  $1^{st}$  or  $2^{nd}$  place in the competition.

The event is covered by a CAMS permit, which provides public liability cover. If you are displaying your MG and not participating in the formal Concours, entry will be free - but you will need to sign an attendance sheet for insurance purposes. If you are not a member of the MGCC and wish to participate in the formal Concours, a small fee of \$5 will be charged. This very modest fee will be levied to help us offset some of the costs of the formal event (trophies, equipment hire, etc).

Please note that vehicles are required to be in place by 1-00 pm (gates will open by 11:30 am) with trophy presentation at approx 4:30 pm for those entering the formal Concours. To alleviate pressure on the volunteers running the event.

Concours entries will not be accepted after 1-30pm and display-only vehicles may be refused entry after 2.00 pm.





Most models of MG are covered in the current stock list and new publications covering the very latest models since China took over production of the Marque may be added as and when they become available.


